

Private data or public data? - 1

Aim	Learn to distinguish between private and public data; reflect on sharing personal data
Duration	20 - 30 min
Number of participants	doesn't matter
Difficulty	light
Conditions	The implementing person should have appropriate previous knowledge
Material	Flipchart or blackboard; Post-Its with various information, e.g. my address, name of my pet, name of my school, picture of me on the beach, my e-mail address, phone number, shoe size

Preparation

Prepare the post-its with different information on them. Use a pen to divide the flip-chart /blackboard into four areas

- Public
- For friends only
- private
- Not safe

Description

Read the information out loud on a Post-It and ask the group in which area they would hang the Post-It. Ask several participants for their opinion. If there is no match, let the whole group vote in which area the Post-It should be glued.

Let the group discuss the results afterwards.

Hint:

"Private" is not always "private". A corresponding discussion about the term is helpful.
